

To place on the predicted North American Datum of 1983, move the projection lines 100 meters north and 130 meters east.  
Gray land lines represent unsurveyed and unmarked locations predetermined by the Bureau of Land Management, Folios S-28 and S-29, Seward Meridian.  
There may be private inholdings within the boundaries of any Federal or State Reservations shown on this map.  
Federal Reservation boundaries established by the Alaska National Interest Lands Conservation Act, PL 96-487, Dec. 2, 1980, are shown as compiled by the administering agencies.  
The Alaska Maritime National Wildlife Refuge consists of all the public land in the coastal waters and adjacent seas of Alaska consisting of islands, islets, rocks, reefs, capes and spires, as well as designated mainland areas.  
Swamps, as portrayed, indicate only the wetter areas, usually of low relief, as interpreted from aerial photographs.
